



Tucson item makes its way into Emmy gift bags

A-list celebrities will get a Tucson souvenir in their Emmy gift bags this weekend.

The necklaces — designed by local artist and sculptor William Skiles — feature one of 30 interchangeable marbles of colored glass held by a metal

clasp on a leather cord. The contemporary jewelry line, called Got All Your Marbles?, is available mostly online and via art shows and wholesale.

“We do retail art shows all over the country. I was in one in Santa Monica, Calif., that we do twice a year, when a scout saw us and followed up with an e-mail,” said co-founder and artist Lisa Stotska,

Emerging magazine offered the jewelry in its gift bags at one

of several gift suites. The suites offer 100 invited celebrities facials, gifts and other indulgences.

Got All Your Marbles? gave 50 of its “Fancy Mod” pendants (\$69 each) and two “Fancy Unity” pendants (\$112 each) for the big event.

The 60th Primetime Emmy Awards are Sunday.

Skiles came up with the original design for the contemporary jewelry in the 1990s. The husband-wife team sold its first

pieces at a jewelry fair in Beverly Hills, and the family business took off from there.

They run their business from Tucson with a Downtown gallery and showroom — Studio 220, 220 E. Congress St.

The jewelry is available at art shows, on the Internet and via wholesale contacts.
